## 12. Course Outcome Competencies:

- To teach basic and intermediate concepts and methods of Web design using HTML and CSS.

  - o Creating standards-compliant Web pages that will display properly on computer monitors, printers, and mobile devices
  - o Embedding media and interactive objects on Web pages
  - o Creating a blog page
  - o Creating pages with tables and forms
  - Creating Web pages that meet accessibility requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and Section 508 requirements for persons with disabilities.
- Individual students who desire will have the opportunity to advance beyond course objectives into advanced HTML by coordinating with instructor

- 13. Attendance Requirements: Students who miss more than 25% of class sessions will receive a grade of F for the term. Participation in a "class session" is defined (for this class) as failing to participate in all activities for a given week. This includes required assignments, discussion forums, and exams/quizzes.
