Students will be required to complete 10 Discussion Board assignments to be submitted through Blackboard. Each Discussion Board assignment requires at least 150 words for the primary post, two responses to other students' primary posts consisting of at least 100 words each and a Summary Conclusion of 100 words. Students will also be required to complete 56 exams through Blackboard. Students will be graded on how

they interact with the other students through Discussion Boards and the use of email netiquette when corresponding with the instructor.
