- i) Video Summaries:
 - a. Watch each of the five Videos

 - i. Summary means that you present a summary of the key points
 - ii. Review means that you compare the topics to that presented in the text book and highlight similarities or discrepancies
 - iii. Critique means that you MUST identify something negative about the video that is, is there bias, incorrect information, presentation could be improved etc.
 - c. Minimum one page, maximum three pages, Times New Roman; 12 font; double space.
 - d. Points deducted for spelling/grammar errors.
 - e. Points will be awarded based on you demonstrating that you watched the videos, and that you thoroughly understand the content.
 - f. This is an individual exercise that is each student's summary should be UNIQUE.
